NEW ORLEANS, LA -- Low-income, first-generation, LGBT+, and minority students are often underrepresented on college campuses, but these population segments have been increasing. These groups face unique challenges both in applying to and attending college. LGBT+ and minority students are more likely to become the victims of discrimination, while low-income and first-generation students may struggle more with their applications and the financial aid process. The population of underrepresented students has steadily been increasing on college campuses:

- 19% of students identify as LGBT+
- 67% of students are from low-income families
